






Layouts--Walter Olson

We also wish to thank **Ron Hall and his wife** for delivering lunch to us on Saturday and to the **Don Stotts** security team for their assistance to registration as well.









Auction Chairman Vince Garguilo Reports



Report on the Southwestern Division Layout--Al Vierich, Chairman

Responsibilities are to build and operate the Division layout.

Team members are Sheila Blaise, Frank and Stella Alabart, and Marilyn Vierich with assistance from Darrell Cabrillo, Don Hofstee, and Bill Augustus.

The layout started the year on eight 6-foot tables. As of Cal-Stewart 1998, we now operate five loops, two "S" gauge American Flyer, two "O" gauge 3-rail and one "Standard" gauge on ten 4-foot by 5-foot panels with two 4-foot bridges which equates to a 12 x 24 layout.

K-Line and Bachmann provided us with buildings which greatly enhanced the layout for Cal-Stewart. In addition, Bachmann sent us two O-narrow gauge sets with buildings to run at Cal-Stewart. Gary Keck at The Train Shack in Burbank has generously assisted us with track. We thank K-Line, Bachmann and Gary Keck for all their help.

At any given time the layout is surrounded by many people. A lot of these people's badges say, "Guest." The layout doesn't bring in dollars to the Club as some have said. However, a working layout is necessary because lest we forget the third word in T.T.O.S. is "Operating" and the layout does bring in people.

I would like to thank everyone associated with the layout for all their time and effort to build it. A special thanks to Sam Mattes who saw my vision for the Club and supported the layout. Also thank you to Calvin Smith who came forth numerous times, especially during the 1997 Cal-Stewart to help with logistical problems which enabled me to establish an orderly flow for all groups participating with layouts and exhibits.

Although I do not plan to be on the Board in 1999, I will continue to work with the layout team. Hopefully, we can take the layout to the public.



The article is titled "Lionel's 1948 Paper Buildings." It recounts Jack's two attempts to build the 1948 Lionel paper buildings, the second attempt fifty years after the first. The second attempt was Jack's first successful attempt. The paper village package also included plans for a small 0-27 layout in which to situate the paper village. This past summer Jack enlisted member Phil Fravesi to help build a portable layout for the village. The layout has been displayed recently at the Folsom History Museum, the Pasadena Cal-Stewart Meet, and the California State Railroad Museum. The layout has been very popular with young children because it is at their eye level and hast lots of action, lights, and noise. 




