



First, I would like to thank some people who when they saw a need at the layout came forward to help: Gary Keck who provided track and road bed as needed; Sam Mattes for accessories; Roy Idlof for all the skirting you see around the layouts; Electric Norman for whistle and bell control accessories; Mike Morgan for continuing to loan an S.P. cab forward to run on the Club layout; and Chris Kee who went beyond the call of duty and bought an MTH Z 4000 transformer for the club to use on the layout. Thank you all for your help this year in making the Southwestern Division Layout #1.

Now to the layout and where do we go in 2001. As of Cal-Stewart, we retired the loop of Standard Guage, which is available to put up at Club Meets if someone want to run their trains. We replaced it with two more loops of "O".

In 2001 we want to extend the layout from the current 24 feet to 34 feet and widen it to 16 feet by adding a 4-foot panel at each end. With this accomplished, we want to place a 24-foot by 2-foot pull thru yard down the center.

There is also discussion of a separate "S" gauge layout which if built would make out Club layout all "O" gauge. So stop by and talk to us.

In addition, if you have trains but no layout and would like to run on Club Day, call me in advance to set it up.

To accomplish the revamping of the layout, we need a 30-foot by 50-foot area for 4 to 5 days to set up the layout and do the work. If you know of, or have that kind of space, please call me. After completing these taks, we would like to take our layout to hospitals, scout meetings and civic affairs.





Hosted by the Canadian Division, one of the oldest division in T.T.O.S., this is the first time the National Convention has been held outside of the U.S.



## Security Team Report




I want to thank all the members of my security team who gave of their time and expertise for the security at Cal-Stewart 2000.


## JOHN FOX PRESENTS MARX SEMINAR
