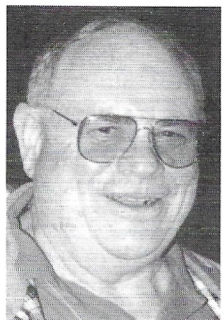

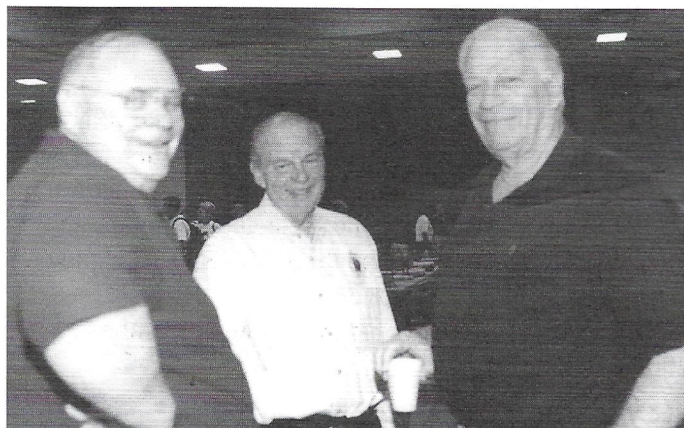
Hi

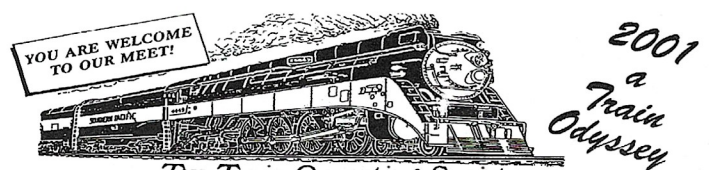

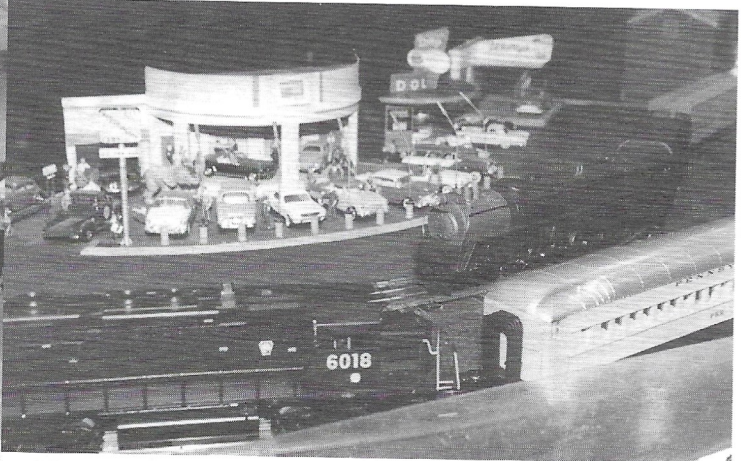

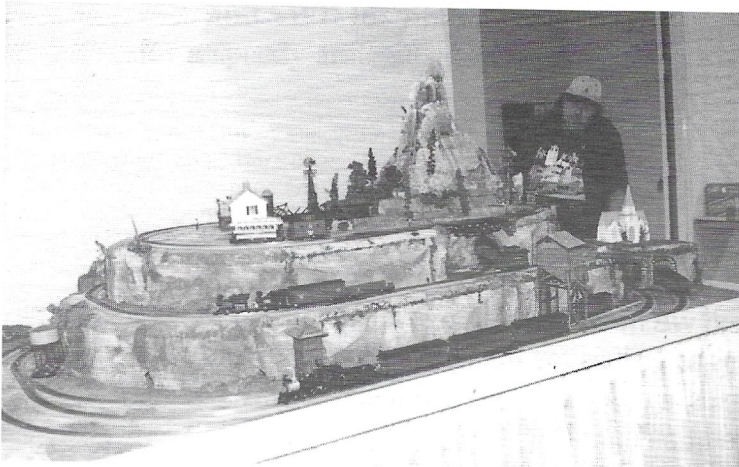

## Southwestern Division’s Narrow Gauge Layout on Display

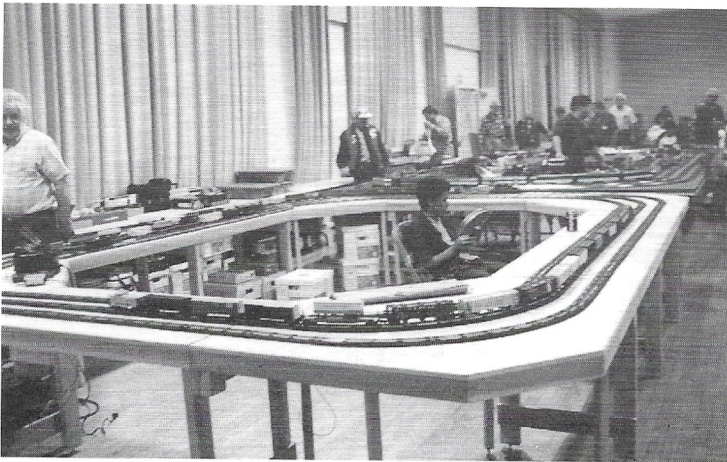

## Southwestern Division's Modular S-Gauge Layout

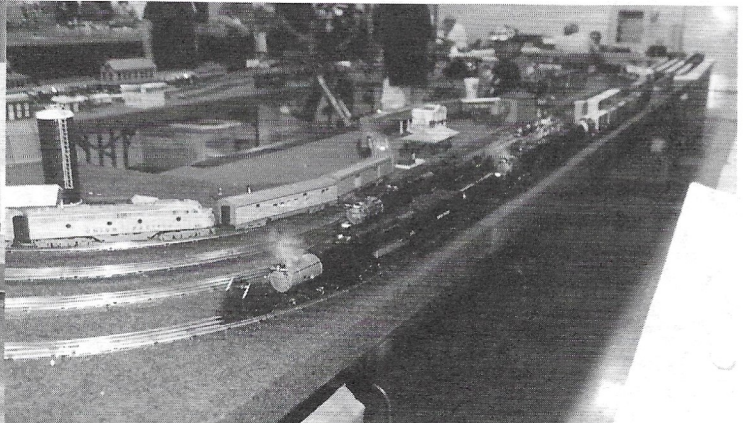


The S-Gauge layout is up and running and continues to be fine tuned.



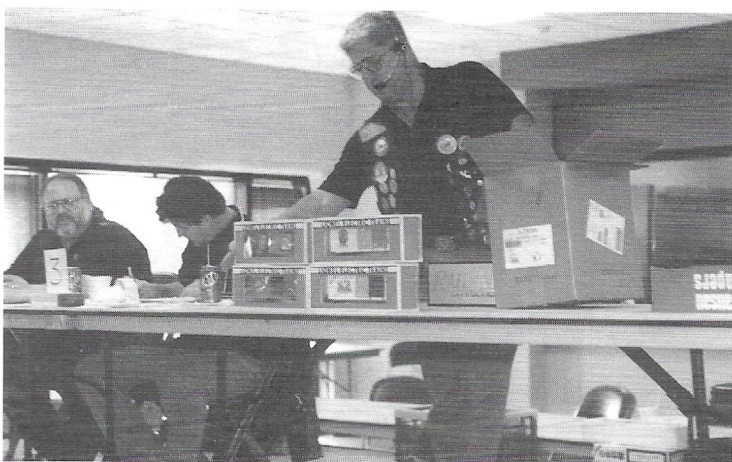

## Repair Tips by Jim Spatafora and Greg Palmer

When you get a locomotive out of moth balls, just rehab on the locomotive is not enough. The whistle tender also needs a clean and lube:

- First, blow out the whistle chamber with compressed air. This removes lint and insects from inside the chamber, which will improve the sound and tenor of the whistle.
- Lube the top of the armature with only two light drops of oil. Plastic compatible oil is what you must use.
- You also might have to put a few drops of oil on the bottom of the armature where it attaches to the whistle fan.
- Spray a contact cleaner on the contacts of the whistle relay. If it still has problems you might use some emery cloth on the contacts, but do this very lightly.
- Oil the wheels, and clean the pick up rollers.
- Finally, check the wires and make sure they are flexible and not cracked.
- You must also check the solder connections on the pick up rollers.

Once all this has been completed you should be able to whistle all night long.

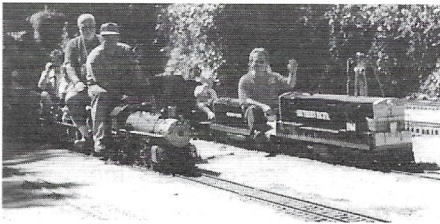

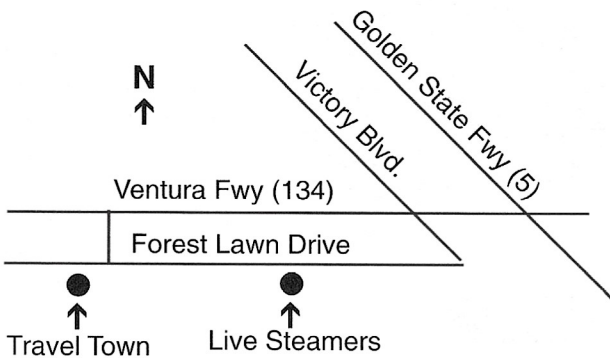

## MOVIE RAILROAD DAYS • SEPTEMBER 29-30

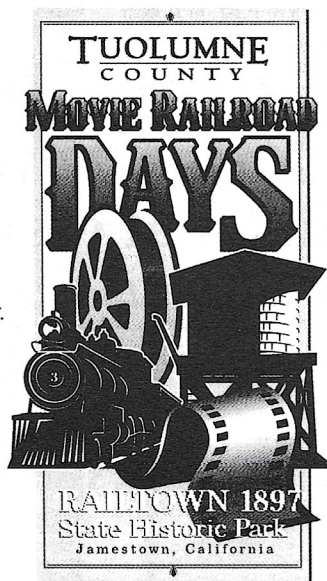

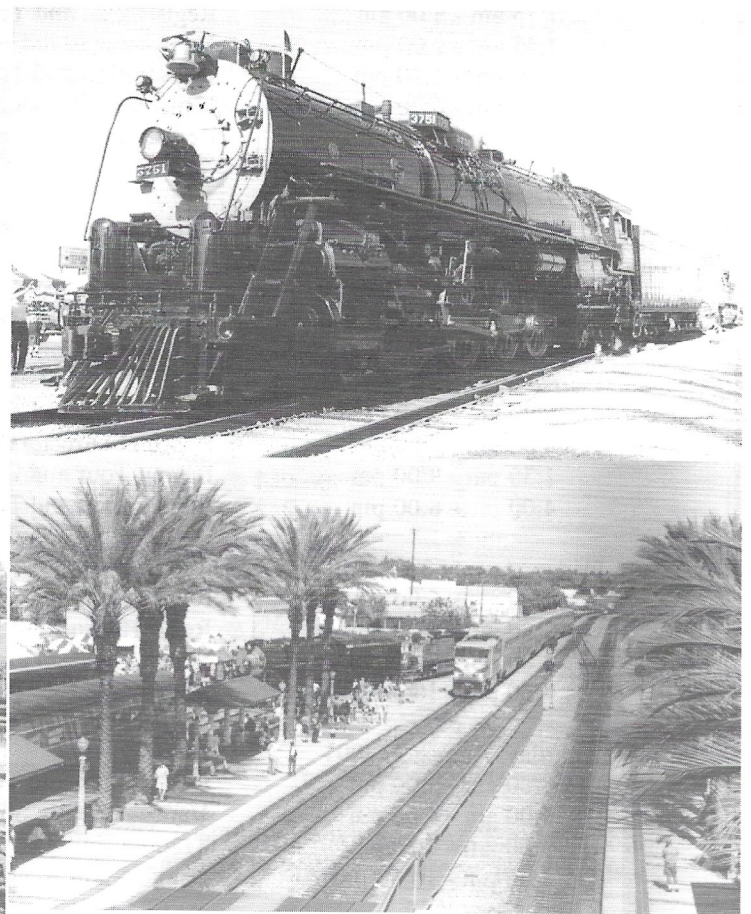
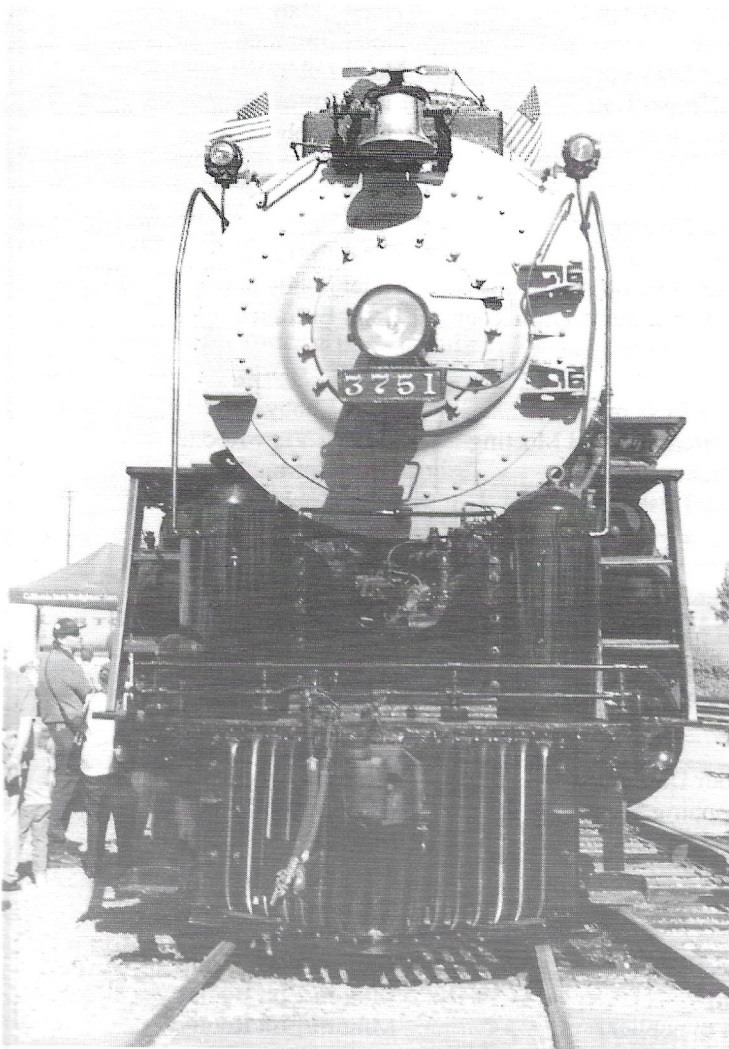


# Report on Fullerton Railroad Days
