2017 ELECTIONS FOR THE SOUTHWESTERN BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Members of **SWD Board of Directors** are voted in for two-year terms, and 2017 is an election year for 2018-2019. As I reported during the October 1st Meet when I opened nominations for the Officer positions, if none of the Officer positions are contested, we will vote the current Board in for another term in by acclamation at the December Meet. So far, none of the Officer positions are contested. Not printing a ballot and then counting the votes at the December Meet, will save us money and a lot of work. Believe me, we are not trying to "sneak" anything by the SWD Membership. If you want to be a Board Member, we will put you on the Board. But be prepared to work for no pay.

Here are the current Officer candidates (as reported at the October 1st Meet): Larry Pearson (President), Hollis Cotton (Vice President), Arlene Berns (Membership Secretary), Jerry Moser (Recording Secretary), and George Blanch (Treasurer). Jerry Moser lives in Hesperia making his attendance at our monthly Board Meetings quite an ordeal. Jerry would be happy if someone would volunteer to replace him. The Board voted during the June 8th Board Meeting to replace Rich Kobliner with George Blanch. Rich passed away on June 4th. Rich selected George Blanch to replace him.

We are currently operating with only six Board members out of seven authorized by our Bylaws. They are: Calvin Smith, Fred Kramer, Larry Tozzi, Hal Rothenborg, Jon Pincus, and Emmett Van Ness. Larry Tozzi's work schedule makes it difficult for him to attend our Board Meetings. Also Hal Rothenborg doesn't like driving at night. He used to host our monthly Board Meetings at his house.

Persons wishing to serve on the Board do not have to be elected. The Board has the power to appoint them to the Board at any time. The Board normally meets at the Hollis Cotton Train House in Granada Hills on the Wednesday following the Monthly Meet every month except November with Cal-Stewart. Also, you do not have to be a Board Member to do volunteer work for Southwestern. Everyone on the Board serves without perks or compensation of any kind. Board Members working Cal-Stewart, for example, have to pay their own registration fees in order to gain admission to the Meet so that they can work it.

We, the current Board, feel that, because of the complexity of running Southwestern, a California Mutual Benefit Corporation, that it is reasonable to expect persons who wish to participate in the running of the SWD have some experience with us before being a candidate for an Officer or Board Position. If persons with no SWD experience wish to run for office anyway, the Board feels that such candidates should submit, in writing to the Board, their reasons and relevant experience and submit this to the Board prior to the December 3rd meet. 

SCHEDULE

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 17th (Setup Only)

1:00-6:00 PM Seller unloading. Buyers and Sellers will be able to pick up registration packets and table assignments at Registration at the main entrance at the North side of the building across from the parking garage. Only sellers and layout people will be allowed in the Hall on Friday. Temporary parking for unloading is just to the right of the front entrance if your tables are in the top floor of the Hall. if your tables are in the bottom floor of the Hall, unloading is on the south end of the building. No trading, shopping, browsing or socializing is allowed. Table covers are required. No carts or hand trucks will be provided, so bring your own. Sellers and layout people must leave the Hall as soon as they have set up. Parking adjacent to the building on both ends is limited and we will need your cooperation to ensure everyone has the opportunity to conveniently unload. Please move your vehicle into the parking structure as soon as it is unloaded. The number of each table sold will be entered on a Free Drawing Ticket. If the seller is still set up ready for business on all of his tables at 3:00 PM Sunday and one of his table numbers is drawn, he will receive \$300.

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 18th

7:30 AM Registration at the main entrance of the Northside of the building across from the parking garage. **Seller unloading from 7:30 to 8:30. No trading is allowed.** Sellers set up, table cover required. All vehicles must be removed from the unloading areas prior to 8:30 AM. Sellers and layout people, except disabled persons, must leave the Hall as soon as they have set up.

8:45 AM Clear the Hall (except disabled persons) to prepare for the opening ceremonies and invocation outside the North entrance.

9:00 AM-5:00 PM Trading in the Hall

11:00 AM-12:00 Noon Marx Show & Tell

12:30 PM-5:00 PM Auction in the Bottom Floor Hall, 10% buyer's premium, 10% seller's premium, a resale license must be shown and resale card filled out to avoid paying sales tax.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 19th

8:00 AM Seller Setup. (Vendor Restock)

9:00 AM-4:00 PM Trading in the Hall.

12 Noon-3:00 PM Auction in the Bottom Floor Hall, 10% buyers premium 10% sellers premium, a resale license must be shown and resale card filled out to avoid paying sales tax.

3:00 PM Grand Drawing and Seller Table Ticket Drawing for prize of \$300. Seller's table(s) must still be set up to be eligible.

4:00 PM - 5:00 PM Pack up, clean up and leave. The table suppliers will be removing the tables at 5:00 pm. See you next year.

5:00 pm Hall Closes. THANK YOU FOR COMING

LOCATION

Cal-Stewart 2017 Toy Train Meet will be at the Glendale Civic Auditorium, 1401 North Verdugo Road, Glendale, CA 91208.

FOOD

Saturday and Sunday there will be a Food Truck outside the Bottom Floor Hall entrance serving breakfast and lunch. Attendees may bring in their own food and drinks. There are some small eating establishments within walking distance across from the college. A guide to local <u>restaurants</u> will be available at the Registration Desk.

PARKING

The entry driveway is between the Civic Auditorium building and the Parking Structure. Temporary parking for unloading is just to the right of the front entrance if your tables are in the top floor Hall. If your tables are on the bottom floor Hall, continue around the building to your left to the south end of the building. Please remove your vehicle into the parking structure as soon as it is unloaded. The cost for parking is \$6.00 per day without in and out privileges. There is no charge for parking on set-up Friday.

FREEWAY ACCESS (See Map on back page)

Coming South Bound past the City of Burbank on the I-5 Freeway, merge onto CA-134 Freeway via Exit 144 toward Glendale/Pasadena. Take the Glendale Avenue exit (EXIT 8) and turn left onto Glendale Ave. Glendale Avenue becomes Verdugo Road and when you have crossed Mountain Street take the first left on to the Glendale Civic driveway.

<u>Coming North Bound</u> past Downtown Los Angeles on the I-5 Freeway, merge onto CA-134 toward Glendale/Pasadena. Take the Glendale Avenue exit (EXIT 8) and turn left onto Glendale Ave. Glendale Avenue becomes Verdugo Road and when you have crossed Mountain Street take the first left on to the Glendale Cvic driveway.

Coming West Bound on the I-210 Freeway through Pasadena, stay straight to go onto CA-134 Freeway. Take the Glendale Avenue exit (EXIT 8) and turn right at the end of the ramp. Go a short distance to Glendale Avenue and turn left onto Glendale Ave. Glendale Avenue becomes Verdugo Road and when you have crossed Mountain Street take the first left on to the Glendale Cvic driveway.

Coming East Bound on the US-101 Freeway, stay to your left to merge onto CA-134 Freeway rather than going South on the Hollywood Freeway. After crossing the I-5 Freeway, take the Glendale Avenue exit (EXIT 8) and turn left onto Glendale Ave. Glendale Avenue becomes Verdugo Road and when you have crossed Mountain Street take the first left on to the Glendale Civic driveway.

HOTELS

There aren't any hotels or motels within walking distance from the Glendale Civic Auditorium. The closest hotel is the Hilton at about 1.5 miles away. Most of the rest are from 2 to 4 miles distance. We recommend that you check on line to find a hotel or motel at hotels.com, booking.com, trivago.com, priceline.com, or tripadvisor.com.




