
The number of free excursion train rides, Museum admissions or Shop tours depends upon the level of membership at which you join. Levels of membership and benefits associated with each level are as follows:



Repair Clinic Growing



Larry Pearson began a Toy Train Repair Clinic as a monthly service to Membership of Southwestern Division in July 1999 and it has been very popular.

Larry encourages members to bring in trains and accessories that need light repairs or lubrication and teaches how to repair or lubricate them or performs the repairs himself on the premises as time permits. He brings lubricant, cleaners, solder, wire, and tools for repairs. Persons needing repairs provide parts, either brought with them or purchased from the parts supplier(s) normally present at the Meets.

Members are reminded to limit the size of the repair project to something that can be done in about 30 minutes. Larry is happy to look at larger projects and advise what he feels needs to be done. He does not offer a take-home repair service, and he does not want to compete with TTOS Members who provide train repairs as a business.

Kudos to Larry Pearson for providing this much needed and appreciated service! (Editor's note: Larry has to be out of town at the time of the May meet; he will resume the Repair Clinic at the June meet).

SWD MODULAR LAYOUT NEEDS YOUR HELP


Southwestern Division is building a modular layout so we can start going to malls, fairs, other train meets, etc. to advertise our club and attract new members.






- 1. Buyers will be required to show their paid up membership card before receiving a bidder's card.

- 3. Please, as much as is possible sell like items as a lot. i.e. 6 transformers sell them as a lot.
- 4. All Sellers will be given 15 minutes to sell.
- 5. No cashing out allowed by a Seller until Auction has officially ended.
