






### RULES FOR TRAIN RACES, PULLING CONTESTS AND DEMOLITION DERBY

- 5. If all wheels of both trains are equally on track yet one train is able to push the other backwards greater than one foot, he is declared winner of that heat.
- Best 2 out of 3 wins.




Southwestern Division members checked in at the Los Angeles Live Steamers ticket office to begin their attendance at the Membership Appreciation Party.



## Highlights of Our Membership Appreciation Day at the L.A. Live Steamers

Bill Kimpel hauls a trainload of SWD passengers seated on brand-new yellow center-bench riding cars. The motive power is a 1/8th scale Western Pacific SD 40-2, owned by our hosts, the Los Angeles Live Steamers (LALS).

Live Steam at its finest! David Johnson brings no. 3002, a Southern Pacific 4-4-2 Atlantic, toward the station to pick up a load of SWD picnickers. They'll be riding on a brand-new red set of center-bench riding cars. The locomotive's removable stack extender keeps the smoke out of everyone's eyes. Like all the trains provided for SWD members to ride, this consist is built to a scale of 1 1/2" to the foot and runs on 7 1/2" gauge track.



Gary Baker pilots a Chesapeake & Ohio SD 40-2, owned by Al Rowsell, president of the Los Angeles Live Steamers. This locomotive is battery-powered and has a realistic sound system that delights the SWD passengers riding behind.



Winston G. Lynn gives his father, Terry, a ride on the 4 3/4" gauge track loop, which is the smaller of the two riding gauges at LALS. The locomotive is Winston's brand-new battery-powered 1/12th scale diesel switcher. The locomotive was built in England by Maxitrak and is lettered W.G.R.R. in honor of Winston. The elder Mr. Lynn is crew chief of the Walt Disney Barn and volunteered to be at LALS especially for the SWD picnic.



The Walt Disney Barn was relocated from Mr. Disney's home (now demolished) on Carolwood Drive in Holmby Hills, California to the LALS facility in Griffith Park by the Carolwood Pacific Historical Society (CPHS). It was moved in 1998, renovated and rededicated a year later. The barn was built by Mr. Disney using the plans from his movie "So Dear to My heart" (1949). It originally housed his workshop and a Centralized Traffic Control (CTC) board for Mr. Disney's backyard miniature railroad.



A replica of Walt Disney's Live Steam locomotive, the CP 173 is located inside the barn. It runs on 7 1/2" gauge track (same as the LALS) and is built to a scale of 1 1/2" to the foot. The prototype ran on the Central Pacific in the latter part of the 19th Century. Mr. Disney's backyard Carolwood Pacific was the inspiration for the Disneyland Railroad. The first two locomotives constructed for the Magiuc Kingdom were based on CP 173's plans, built to a larger scale. To learn more, see the book *Walt Disney's Railroad Story* by Michael Broggie, published by Pentrex.

#### Highlights of LA Live Steamers, Continued



TTOS member Steve Waller arranged to have the barn open for the Southwestern Division Picnic. Mr. Waller set up an LGB "G" scale layout especially for the event, depicting the Grizzly Flats Railroad, the prototype of which is located in the backyard of legendary Disney animator and TTOS-SWD member Ward Kimball.



Railroadiana meets Disneyana in this corner of the barn. Two toy prototypes for Hartland "G" scale Disney locomotives are among the treasures.



Visitors enjoy the "G" scale model of Ward Kimball's "Chloe" locomotive, named for Mr. Kimball's youngest daughter. It ran back and forth on a straight line of track, utilizing the LGB No. 80090 Automatic Shuttle mechanism.



Here is a 1/12th scale live steam Shay locomotive, built by legendary Disney animator and LALS member Ollie Johnston. Mr. Johnston's pioneering miniature backyard layout inspired Walt Disney to build his own in the slightly larger 1/8th scale in 1950.



A closer shot of the Grizzly Flats Depot, manufactured by PIKO. This example comes from Ward Kimball's personal collection, on loan especially for the SWD picnic. A LIONEL No. 8-87207 Mickey and Donald Handcar is in the foreground.



This gondola car actually ran on Walt Disney's Carolwood Pacific Railroad. It is resting on the only crossover track built for Mr. Disney's backyard pike. The special street sign in the background commemorating 355 N. Carolwood Drive was presented by the City of Los Angeles to Mr. Disney's daughter, Diane, in honor of the efforts she made to move the barn to Griffith Park and open it to the public. Currently, the barn is open the third Saturday of every month from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.






