



Volunteers renovate outdoor model railroad at county fairgrounds

OMEBODY pass the golden spike — the Ganesha Junction Railroad at Fairplex is back.

A ribbon-cutting on Sept. 5 will mark the rebirth of more than 5,000 feet of track, lights, billboards, trucks, drive-in theater

Ights, billocards, trucks, arive-in theater and miniature townscapes.

And when the Los Angeles County Fair opens on Sept. 11 for its 75th year, visitors will hardly recognize the outdoor railroad that's been a fixture at the fair since 1935, but had fallen on hard times in recent

In April, Fairplex officials were seeking a new operator for the railroad, someone to oversee its operation, to upgrade it, modernize it ... make it again the crowdawing attraction it had been for generations as the largest and oldest garden rail-



The layout is segmented into vigaettes — oil refinery, station, mountain, dock, desert, prairie dog garden. ceramic hillside village; and winding rivers that will carry boats and float planes.

The familiar drive-in theater has been upgraded and will feature live television pictures from miniature cameras mounted on the trains; young-sters will drive circus trains at the interactive corner; visi-tors will see how a garden railroad fits in a typical backyard.

"This is a family hobby," said Ed Saalig, a Montclair High School counselor who concedes he's become a Fairolex fixture as onsite supervi-

"Women like to garden; guys like to play with trains," he explained. "We want visi-tors to see that they can have a garden railroad in their own yard

yard."
"Our goal as a club," said Greeno, "is to educate and promote the hobby." He esti-mates more than 100 members will have contributed 6,000 hours of work to the rebirth of the Ganesha Junction Rail-wed by fair this.

The club inherited a tired world of miniatures; old, weathered buildings, worn-out equipment, scenery that showed every one of its 67 harsh years of service to fair-

goers. Saalig said the remarkable effort just sort of happened.
"Every building, everything is at members' homes being repainted or rebuilt. Everyone just took something wat here." Saalig when we got here," Saalig

said.
"We can't really calculate what our members are putting into this," he said, pointing out a handful of displays and rojects members funded on

"We contracted to have just one main line running for the one main line running for the fair. Now we may have a dozen trains running; all the buildings have been repaint-ed, we have the interactive part for the kids.

"We're making this user-friendly," Toohey emphasized.




T.T.O.S., S.W.D. #1 Board Minutes




