

The Phoenix Division did an outstanding job in organizing a first class convention and banquet. One of the highlights of my trip which was unexpected involved the opportunity to meet with newly hired Lionel executives.

New Lionel Texas Pacific F-3 Auctioned Lionel in the days preceding the convention announced a new President and CEO. He is Dick Maddox who has had several decades of model railroading experience as the lead person at Bachmann. 

The Club Layout is a popular display at Southwestern Division's monthly Train Meet. Pictures were taken at June Meet.






In the planning stages are smaller Club modular layouts for HO and G Scale.


Utilizing the modular design enhances the mobility of the layouts for display at hospitals, malls, shows, and conventions.





Trains move through towns and villages, rural farm lands, mountains and forests, across trestles, through tunnels, alongside of waterways. The layout is a virtual feast for the senses.












The Garden Layout at Fairplex features a wide variety of scenery and accessories.

Anonymous no more: unknown on stamp named—By Michael Baadke



The beaming face of young Joe Adda, Jr., who looms larger than life over a speeding model train on the 32 cent Electric Toy Trains stamp from the 1920s Celebrate the Centruy set issued May 28, 1998.

In an article by Peter Genovese published in the August 23 New Jersey Sunday Star-Ledger, Adda, now 75, remembers how the original illustration was created by his father, a commercial artist.

The illustration first appeared on the cover of a 1929 Lionel train catalog.

From an office in New York City, the senior Adda did illustrations for Pillsbury, Coca-Cola and other well-known companies.

Joe Jr. still has an intereest in toy trains.

The Hunterdon County, N.J., farmer learned that he was going to appear on a stamp when he spotted a picture of the planned issue while leafing through an issue of *Classic Toy Trains* magazine.

The Train Doctor's Home Remedies—Simple, Inexpensive Operating Improvement Tips

*Increase conductivity and remove tarnish and dirt from tubular or solid rail track sections with a non metallic abrasive scouring pad - like Scotch Brite, available in various grades. Fine or extra fine will work great. Also works great on wheels, and axles.

*Often overlooked when lubricating any three rail motive power, is lubrication of the pick up roller. Only a small drop of oil on each side of the roller axle will help reduce wear and help prolong the life of the roller, besides improving conductivity. The best lubricant here, however, is graphite.

*With many prewar tinplated trains bulbs used for lighting, the new replacement bulbs are often manufactured with the brass bases just a slight bit too short. This when the replacement bulb is put into the old socket, it doesn't work. Frustrated mechanics immediately think they have a bad bulb. Try a tiny drop of solder on the center of the bulb base or socket center contact. This added solder can make up the gap, and possibly eliminate unnecessary repairs, or additional bulb purchase with the same results.

*Lubrication of the axles of the motor armature is often done over abundantly. It is important to lubricate just the armature axles a small amount. The wick on older motors will need only 2 small drops. Over lubrication will cause the armature plates to become gummed up giving the train doctor a difficult job to clean and repair.

*Following these simple tips will eliminate the need to take two smoke pills and a call to the Train Doctor next morning.
